WORKSHOP ON MONSOONS AND WEATHER EXTREMES

Malaysian Meteorological Department, Petaling Jaya 9 March 2016

The Workshop on Monsoons and Weather Extremes was jointly organised by Malaysian Meteorological Department (MMD), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia's Southeast Asia Disaster Prevention Research Initiative (SEADPRI-UKM), Asian Network on Climate Science and Technology (ANCST), City University of Hong Kong and Indian Institute of Science (IISc) Bangalore. It was held on 9 March 2016 at MMD in Petaling Jaya, Malaysia. The purpose of the workshop was to provide a platform to stimulate discussion on Asian climatic phenomena with respect to the changing climate and extreme conditions as well as chart a pathway forward for scientific collaborations.

This workshop was a seguel of the ANCST Workshop on Atmosphere-Ocean Interactions in the Indo-Pacific Basin and Their Impact on Asian Climate, held on 25-26 November 2014 which concluded on a need for a climate scientist research group focusing on Asian climatic phenomena related to the oceans of South and Southeast Asia as as atmospheric-ocean well interactions. Such a group aims to facilitate the exchange of scientific information on changing climate extreme conditions to communities and governments.

The programme commenced with opening remarks by Director General. Malaysian Meteorological Department. This was followed by four technical paper presentations by prominent experts involved Professor Lord Julian Hunt of University of Cambridge, Professor Johnny Chan of City University of Hong Kong, Professor P. N. Vinayachandran of Indian Institute of Science Bangalore and Dr. Liew Juneng of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia. Local and regional experts as well as decisionmakers were involved in the workshop and provided inputs on future plans and roadmaps toward improved understanding on weather and climate extremes in the tropics. Mr. Helmi Abdullah, Director of the Research & Technical Development Division, Malaysian Meteorological Department discussion and closed the session.
